#### About this workshop:

This workshop will provide physicians, trainees, and advanced practice providers with multidisciplinary treatment options (medical management, sex therapy, and pelvic floor physiotherapy) for patients with sexual dysfunction and pelvic floor disorders. We will also review how pelvic floor reconstructive surgery affects sexual function in patients.

The workshop facilitators will include 2 urogynaecologists, a gynaecological endocrinologist, a clinical psychologist, and a pelvic health physiotherapist.

## By the end of this workshop, attendees will learn to:

- 1. Define classification of female sexual dysfunction and common sexual complaints in a urogynaecology practice
- 2. Review the role of sex therapy and pelvic floor physiotherapy in treatment of female sexual dysfunction for patients in urogynaecology.
- 3. Discuss evidenced based medical management of female sexual dysfunction including pain disorders and female sexual interest and arousal disorder (FSIAD)
- 4. Review the evidence on how Urogynaecological surgeries affect sexual function in patients.

#### About this workshop:

Stress Urinary Incontinence is a common condition with multiple surgical treatment options, each with differing patient outcomes. Following recent increased scrutiny; the hitherto gold standard in treatment mid urethral slings have lost popularity, with patients becoming mesh averse and requesting traditional procedures.

As such, the landscape in stress incontinence surgical management has undergone significant change, with physicians encountering steep learning curves due to decreased exposure to traditional surgical procedures. The application of surgical simulation aims to improve surgical performance and patient outcomes.

This workshop is targeted at fellows and young consultants providing an overview of management of stress urinary incontinence and the practical enhancement of surgical training.

## About this workshop:

Pessary management is an important skill in the conservative management of pelvic organ prolapse. This half day interactive workshop is designed for all healthcare professionals involved in pessary fitting and assessment, to improve clinical skills and confidence. The workshop will cover clinical assessment of prolapse including levator avulsion injuries, common pathology findings to be aware of, management of pessary complications, as well as the role of nurse specialists and physiotherapists in the management of patients with pessaries.

A hands-on practical session with pelvic models and different pessary types as well as the use of case studies will assist with building confidence in the pessary management of vaginal prolapse.

# Delegates who participate in this workshop will gain:

- 1. An understanding of the clinical assessment of prolapse including levator avulsion, and an overview of what pessaries are most appropriate in different clinical situations.
- 2. Guidance in the identification of vulval and vaginal pathology, as well as the management of pessary complications.
- 3. Insight into the role of physiotherapists and nurse-led clinics in pessary management including credentialling processes.

#### **ROBOTIC VERSIUS / HYBRID LAPAROSCOPY WORKSHOP (OFFSITE)**

#### **About this workshop:**

This Robotic Versius/Hybrid Laparoscopy Workshop for Burch Colpo Suspension and Vault Suspension: Sacrocolpopexy & Pectopexy offers a focused exploration of advanced pelvic organ prolapse repair techniques using robotic and hybrid laparoscopic approaches. Emphasis will be placed on anatomical landmarks, procedural steps, and operative tips for Burch colposuspension, sacrocolpopexy, and pectopexy.

The workshop also includes strategies for managing retropubic bleeding and incorporates a colorectal perspective on posterior compartment prolapse, including ventral rectopexy. Designed for surgeons aiming to refine their skills in minimally invasive pelvic reconstructive surgery, this session bridges anatomical insight with robotic and hybrid technique mastery.

## By the end of this workshop, attendees will learn to:

- 4. Understand the anatomy of the major constituents of urethral and pelvic organ support represented by the Arceus Tendineus Fascia Pelvis, the paravaginal support, the Levator Ani muscles, the cardinal and uterosacral ligaments and pectineal ligament.
- 5. Understand the basis/rationale and surgical steps of SUI cure by Burch Colpo suspension.
- 6. Understand the basis/rationale and surgical steps of POP cure by Sacro colpopexy and Pectopexy
- 7. Practice the surgical steps of Burch Colpo suspension on a laparoscopic/robotic simulator.
- 8. Practice the surgical steps of Sacro colpopexy on a laparoscopic/robotic simulator.
